Merv and Gary also conducted an interesting visit to the goal: thanks so much.



It was an early importer and retailer of British cars.

There were many old cars and trucks. Included was a 1927 International truck. It was called a 'speed truck'. The sign said, 'Top Speed: Fast, well, it was in 1927.'

A local plumber has set up a mini foundry, making castings in sand moulds. He demonstrated making the sand mould and pouring the molten metal into the mould. Today, he is using brass. Being a plumber, he gets a lot of brass. He also said that the new lead-free brass does not melt or cast as well.

Club Legends Gary Mellington

Our club includes people with a wealth of knowledge and experience that we wish to preserve. This is #13 in a series about these "Club Legends".



Gary was born in Prahran in 1944. He moved to Geelong when he was about $2^{1/2}$

His first job was as a "gopher" in a fruit stall. He later became an apprentice motor mechanic for Brian Cross, an early WDHVC member.

He married Noreen in 1968 and they had four children and nine grandchildren - eight boys and one granddaughter. They now have heaps of greats.

His first car was '28 Dodge then a '49 Standard Vanguard, which was originally his father's, then his brothers and then Gary's. It was the first engine that he rebuilt.

Other cars he has owned: 1953 early Holden; an S series Valiant; a ZC Fairlane; a Beetle; a Kombie; and an HD Fairlane.

His favourite car was the Valiant. It was his first modern car. He says it was lovely to drive - very comfortable and a good family car.

He still has the '28 Dodge: it's been around for about 60 odd years. The '37 Oldsmobile he has had around 50 years. (He sounds like my husband, who can't get rid of anything.)

The FJ Holden took around four years to restore, during which time he had a heart attack.

Gary says the hardest thing about restoring is the painting.

His dream car is all that he has: he doesn't need anything else.

Gary was a member until 1979, when his membership lapsed. He rejoined in 1989 and has been a member ever since.

Events he has enjoyed are Sunday runs with young families; the 2-day rallies to Warrnambool, Castlemaine and Lorne; runs to Melbourne to the Centenary of Cars and Avoca.

Gary and Noreen enjoy the social side of the club and getting the cars out and meeting old and new friends. His greatest enjoyment is his family and his wife.

He also was part of a three piece band including Trevor Schneider and Graham Paech and played music for old time dancing for 45 years.

Gary's thinks the WDHVC is a great club with wonderful people who all seem to get on well. He says it is a pity we are getting older, with not enough young ones coming along. Looks like we will all have to live a bit longer!



The Packard was once a luxury automobile model (1899 – 1962) which was synonymous with luxury in the United States. It had a well-established reputation alongside Rolls-Royce, Mercedes-Benz and Cadillac. The Packard has been one of the favourite import brands of the well-to-do in Japan since 1931, including among members of the royal family and nobility. The car you see on display was actually owned and driven by the founder of A & C Inc. Please do not touch."
