A member may advise the club (best the Registrar or Secretary) if they wish to participate in any other club event, be it local or interstate. The club official records that participation and the member may then record the participation under a club event, provided the route to/from (more appropriately for interstate events) is mostly direct.

The operator may choose to use a combination of club and private use entitlements, an outline of which should be advised to the club officials before departure. Obviously for a rally over long distances, club entitlement is appropriate.

If operators wish to combine an interstate club event with a period of private use, that is also permitted under the system principles. Integrity and common sense are required as any seeming abuse will impact the entire historic vehicle community.

MEMBERS PLEASE NOTE: YOU MUST HAVE A LOG BOOK OTHERWISE IT IS ILLEGAL TO TAKE YOUR VEHICLE ON THE ROAD.

Francis Birtles - Australia's Forgotten Hero

Francis Birtles (1881 - 1941) Born in Fitzroy in Melbourne and died in Croydon Sydney. Birtles is best known for his overland drive from London to Melbourne in 1927/28 in a Bean.

During his life he was an adventurer, sailor, soldier, cyclist, policeman, photographer, filmmaker, artist, journalist, author, mechanic, a record-breaking driver, sportscar collector and a grey nomad.

He set many records on a bicycle riding from Perth to Sydney and around Australia as well as in New Zealand before setting records in a variety of vehicles.

Some of the cars that he used were: a 1912 Brush, a 1913 T-Ford, a 1917 Maxwell, a 1920 Hudson 6, a 1924 Oldsmobile a 1924 Bean, a 1926 Bean (Scrap Iron) and a 1935 Vauxhall 20/60.

He became known as "The Overlander" as a result of travelling across Australia, north to south and east to west at least 88 times.

His drive from London to Melbourne (26,000 km) involved many hardships as roads did not exist in some Asian countries. Some ingenuity was required to proceed. The photo below shows Birtles proceeding very slowly through thick mud, the back wheels having been removed and chains wrapped around the hubs for traction.



He was joined by a Canadian hitch-hiker Percy Stollery in Calcutta. Without the help of Percy Stollery he would not have succeeded in making his way to Rangoon and onwards to Singapore.

The car was shipped to Darwin, but on arrival was 'impounded' by customs. Through the intervention of the Primate Minister, the car was released and Birtles continued the journey arriving in Sydney in 1928.

There have been two re-enactments of Birtles famous drive.



Lang and Beverly Kidby in 2014; and in 2024 - Warren Brown and Matthew Benn retraced the route raising money for the RFDS.

After discovering a Gold Mine, Birtles became a rich man. He collected many sportscars, all light blue and open topped.

He married for the second time in 1935 and he and Nea, drove a motor-home all over Australia. Birtles should be much better known as a famous Australian Adventurer.



Birtles' Sundowner is now part of the collection in the National Museum of Australia.



Fun Fact: The Sundowner was named for Birtles' habit of arriving at outback homesteads just in time for dinner.

Museums we have been to

(article from Mike Norman)

During our travels across this big country of ours, Michelle and I have (unconsciously or otherwise) made a point of seeking out Motor Museums and car collections. I'm lucky in that my partner also shares a love of cars and we enjoy looking at machinery of all shapes and sizes .

So here's a quick snap shot of some of the car collections we've seen over the years. If you have other recommendations from your travels please let us know and we will add them to our 'to do list'. Sadly some of the ones we have visited have closed or are about to close.

New South Wales

National Transport Museum—Inverell - well worth a visit if you happen to be up that way. They have a wide collection of vehicles spanning a good cross-section of years, including buses, motorcycles etc. The museum itself is housed in a large purpose-built facility. Vehicles are often loaned on consignment by their owners for a period of time before being changed out.

Forbes—McFeeters Car Museum

I think we called into this one on a trip back from Qld one year. Nice building with a good collection of old vehicles some of which come out for local events I believe.

Bathurst—National Motor Racing Museum

At the end of Con-od straight there is the National Motor Racing Museum. Things have probably changed a bit since I was there in 2010, but I would recommend a visit if you happen to be passing through.

Gosford Car Museum—Now Closed

We visited this one in 2017. It was interesting to visit and had a nice range of vehicles from all eras. Unfortunately it was closed in 2019 after a dispute with the ATO.

Victoria

Holden Museum - Echuca—now closed

This one was well worth a visit sadly it was sold and closed in 2024, with many of the items that didn't belong to private owners auctioned off. I believe that there is now a new National Holden museum located in Coffs Harbour in NSW.

Powerhouse Motor & Car Museum—Portland Vic

We happened on this one on our way back from WA one year. Stopping in Portland we decided to visit this local museum. Although small the vehicles, represent the local collectors. Again this is worth a visit if you are passing through that area.

Shepparton Car Museum.

I visited this in 2018 and it has now evolved into the *Museum of Vehicle Evolution*. I'm looking forward to going back to see what its now become.

South Australia

Birdwood Mill National Motor Museum. This one had been on my list for a while and I was very excited to visit it. The main entrance hall has a rebuilt old time garage that was saved locally— all glass. The main halls are dedicated to Holden (the main plant was in Elizabeth in SA), but further exploration revealed a large display hall with many more marques. There was also a nice display dedicated to Australian drive-in cinemas (sadly long gone in most places however some remain). In a separate building there is a recreation of a 1920s garage. If you are visiting SA, this museum is well worth visiting. Combined with a visit to the wineries and Hahndorf I think you could have a fabulous trip. The museum is also the destination for the annual Bay to Birdwood rally.

Western Australia

York Motor Museum. Michelle and I specifically took a trip out to York last time we were in WA. The museum now occupies the building where the original Ford dealership was located in the 60s. Our Zephyr was originally sold from that dealership in 1960 so it was a bit of a homecoming for us. I wasn't disappointed and really enjoyed the range of vehicles on display. Some of our members have visited this one previously.

There are a few others we've been to, but I couldn't find the pics amongst the many I have, so that will be another article when I find them. 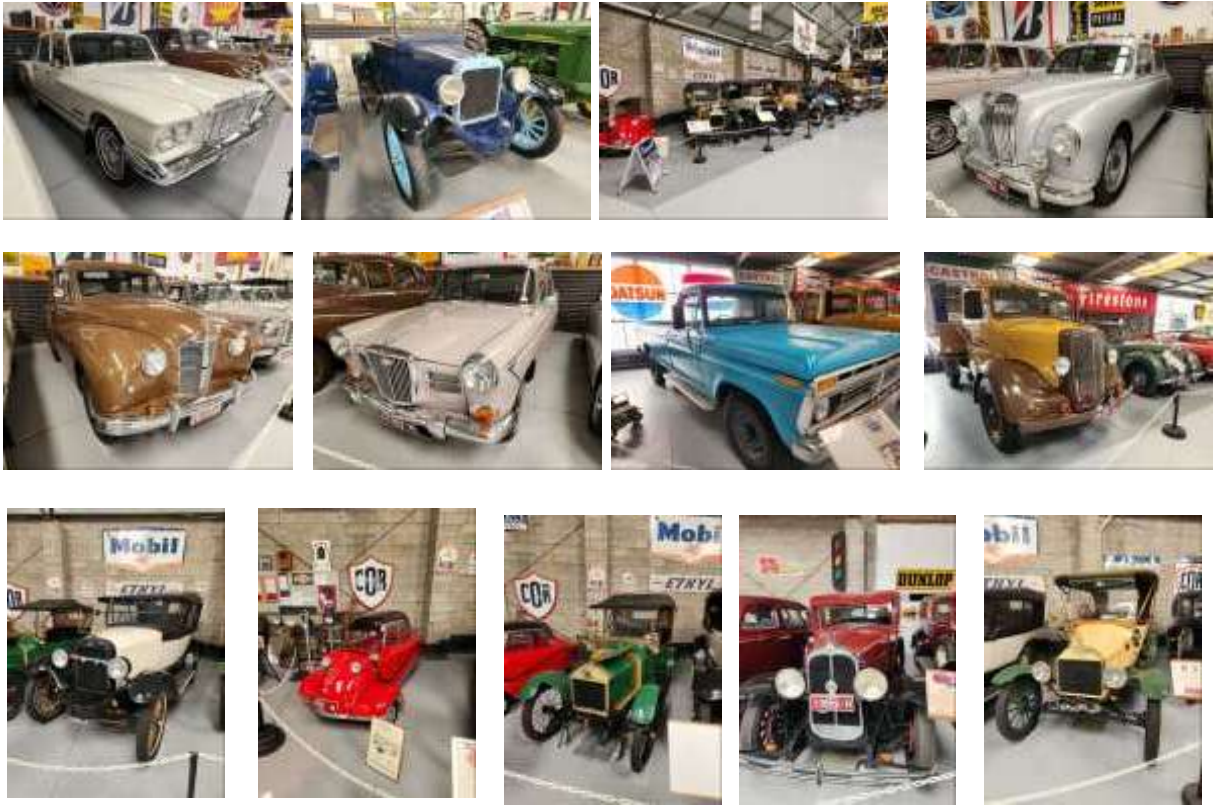

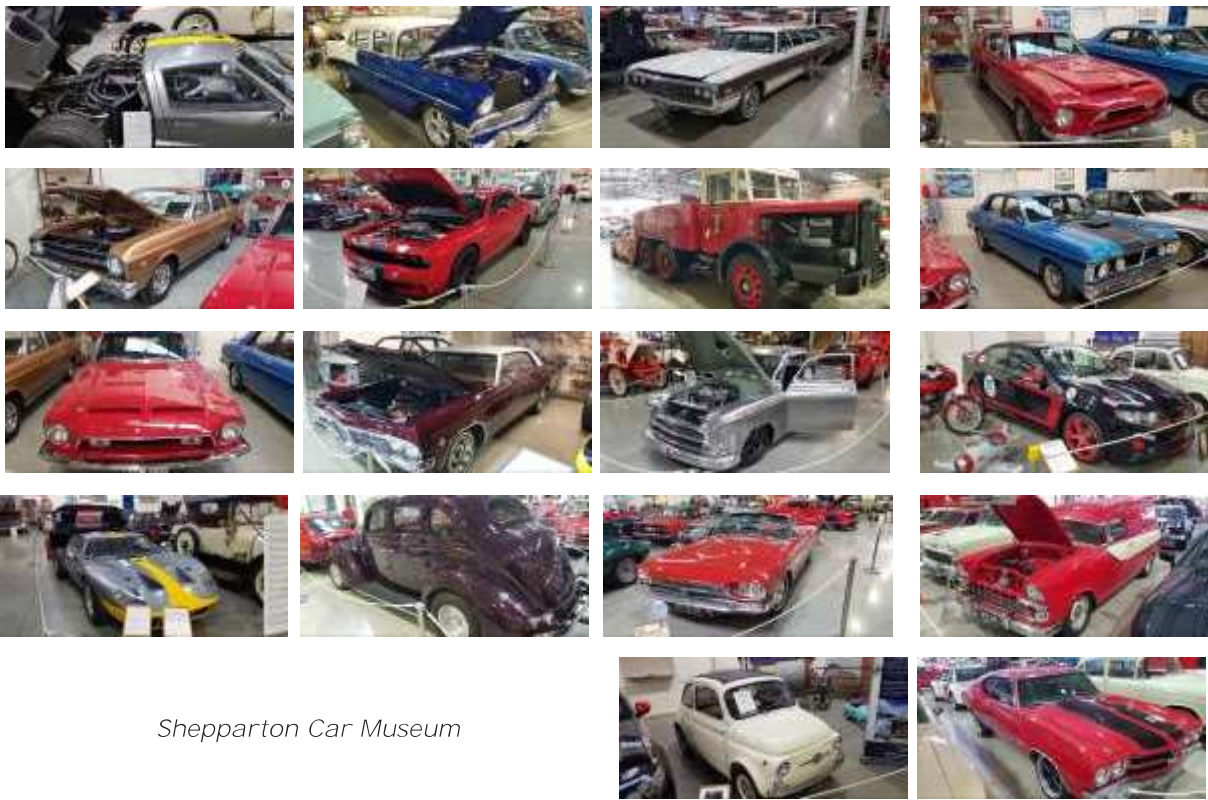

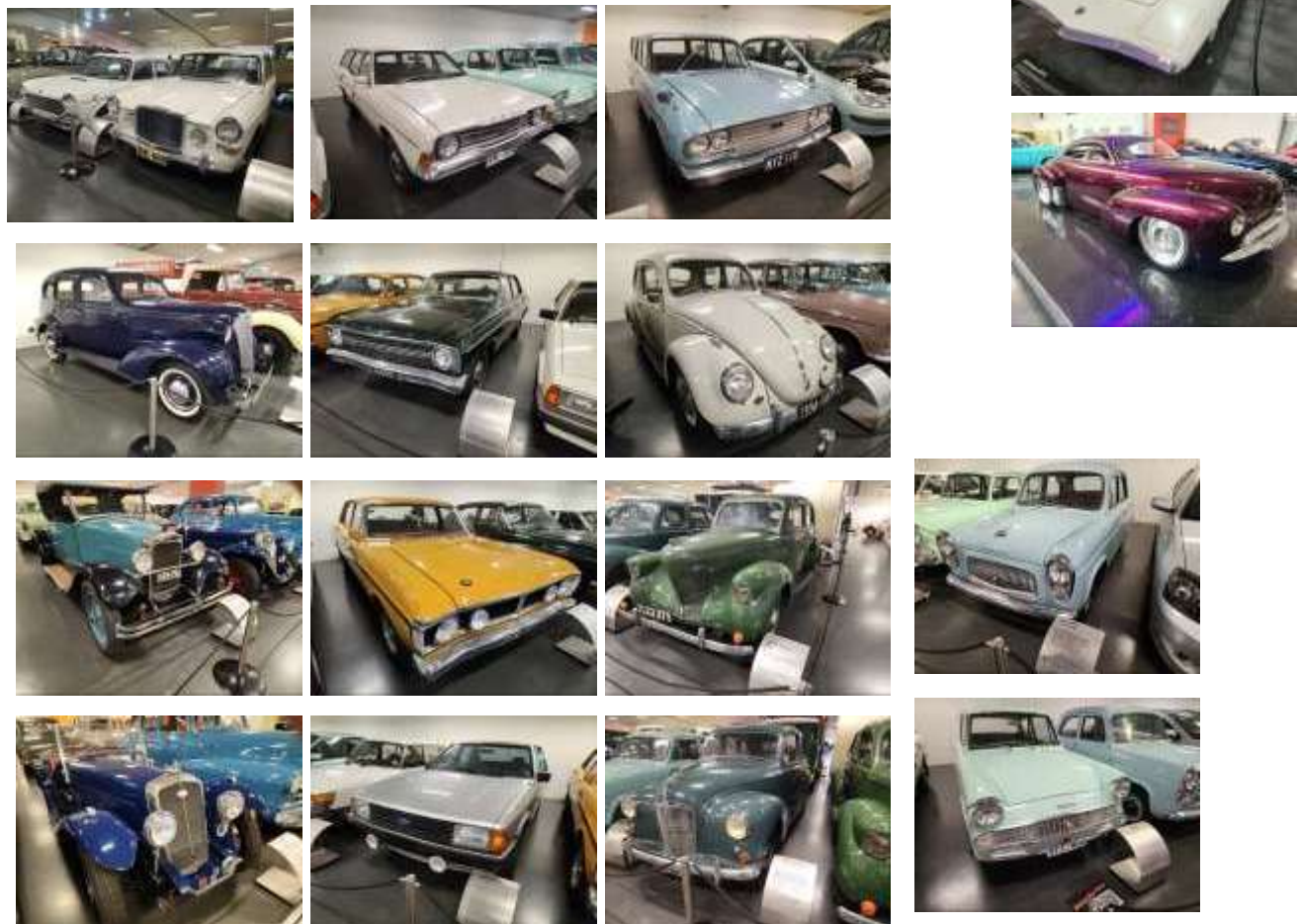
