



General Meeting Minutes

Minutes of the General Meeting held Thursday 8th August 2024 at the clubrooms. **President,** Robin Fletcher, opened the meeting at 8pm with a welcome to attendees and the usual advice on exits and audible phones. The attendance roll indicated 58 members in attendance including "Oscar's grandfather" plus one visitor and 12 apologies.

The visitor, John Stephenson, owner of a VW Kombi indicated his interest in joining the club. Name badges were presented to Rodney and Di Michell, who have recently become club members.

The President then asked the gathering to observe a minute's silence to remember the two members who had recently died. Both Richard Murrell and Robin Pilcher had been valuable contributors to club activities. Robin's '36 Dodge and '54 Chevrolet utilities were usual and obvious vehicles at club events and inputs on the Facilities subcommittee helped the club. John Truman spoke of Richard Murrell's background in the family garage at Nathalia, his role as our AOMC delegate from 2014 to 2020 and his '66 HR Holden wagon, Triumph TR6, Rambler and Toyota Crown.

Minutes:

Minutes of the July 11 meeting, as published in the August Journal, were accepted following a motion from *Phame McCall*, 2nd *Peter Daldy*. No business arising.

Correspondence:

Consumer Affairs Victoria noting our application to change club rules had been accepted as had our payment of \$424.60. A memorandum had been prepared for Peter Vibert to use in satisfying an ATO request that he be able to furnish proof of his Treasurer role and that of the official club contact person with the ATO.

Correspondence with membership enquiry (R.Marin).

Further Numurkah Show contact clarifying their expectation that our club could have heritage vehicles to display at an allocated site on October 23.

Two one-page articles from May 1939 Argus newspaper were provided by Ray Mullins for members' attention. One celebrated Atlantic Union Oil Co. which had commenced its Victorian distribution in 1927. The 1939 pictures indicated Albion tankers and "Miss Atlantics" in hostess apparel dispensing product at service stations. The other page detailed Ford Geelong's work producing Mercury body panels and completed cars with 75% Australian content.

Barry Croke moved acceptance of his report, 2nd Ray Mullins and passed.

REPORTS:

Treasurer Peter Vibert spoke to his four-page report of club transactions and a page showing club account balances. Members' payments for the Floriade Canberra (\$5400) and Rally of the Valley (\$1112.50) had been received. Club membership payments for 2025 had started with about 60% opting for the \$30 subscription with electronic Journal, and 40% taking the traditional mailed Journal as part of the \$80 fee. Elder's insurance policy (\$2889.05) for your club property had been paid. Peter Vibert moved and Terry Brennan

Peter Vibert moved and Terry Brennan seconded acceptance for the report. Passed.

Leigh Johnston outlined the Events s/c listing of activities noted on p.6 & 7 of the Journal.

celebration display for Chrysler and MG vehicles. Bendigo SWAP also experiencing a new council demand to have two water fountain trailers present at \$2000 each. AOMC and Federation were unable to convince VicRoads to adopt a common expiry date for multiple vehicles. ATO had notified the Federation that the October 31 tax return deadline had been extended to March 31 and an ATO helpline was available. VicRoads is enabling clubs to obtain a CPS register of their members' vehicles once annually.







Oxford Series MO 1948-54



After the Second World War the much larger 13.5-fiscal horsepower **Oxford Series MO** replaced the range of ten-horsepower series M, Morris Twelve and Morris Fourteen. It was announced on 26 October 1948, along with the new 918 cc Morris Minor and the 2.2-litre Morris Six MS. Designed by Alec Issigonis, the Oxford, along with the Minor, introduced unibody construction techniques. The MO was sold as a 4-door saloon and 2-door *Traveller* estate with an exposed wooden frame at the rear. Both were four-seaters. A six-cylinder version was sold as the Morris Six MS. It was replaced by the Oxford Series II, announced Tuesday 18 May 1954.



Car central to forensic case over the disappearance of Azaria Chamberlain

The National Museum of Australia, in Canberra has acquired the 1977 model yellow hatchback V8 Torana, which was central to the conviction and ultimate exoneration of Lindy and Michael Chamberlain, over the 1980 disappearance of their daughter, Azaria.

The disappearance of Azaria Chantel Loren Chamberlain (11 June – 17 August 1980) became one of the most infamous events in contemporary Australian social and legal history. Despite the family's protestations that Azaria was taken by a dingo at Ayers Rock (now Uluru), in October 1982, Lindy Chamberlain was tried and convicted of murder and Michael Chamberlain was convicted of being an accessory to the crime.

Lindy was given a life sentence and imprisoned for over three years, before new evidence forced a royal commission that ultimately resulted in the 1988 exoneration of Lindy and Michael Chamberlain by the Northern Territory Criminal Court of Appeal.

The 1977 Torana played a key role in the convictions with forensic evidence which alleged Azaria's blood was in the car. The royal commission subsequently found this substance was bitumen, sound deadener, milkshake, and copper dust.

Michael Chamberlain said that the car represents the one of the worst perversions of forensic science in Australia's history: 'While the car represents this gross injustice, it also symbolises freedom, as a result of the proper and independent revision of forensic science, which eventually saw Lindy exonerated,' said Dr Chamberlain.

'Because I love this car, it is with some sorrow that I am releasing it to the National Museum but I also take comfort from the decision, because I know the Museum will take better care of the vehicle than I can. It will survive not just as an example of a total forensics' failure, but ultimately as a symbol of the triumph of Australian justice,' said Dr Chamberlain.

National Museum senior curator Sophie Jensen said that, 'the Torana is an important addition to the Museum's National Historical Collection which will help future generations understand this important and tragic episode in Australian legal history'.

The dismantled car was held by Northern Territory authorities until 1990 when it was returned to Michael Chamberlain, who restored it. The National Museum acquisition also includes Dr Chamberlain's Bible, his running shoes worn at Ayers Rock, clothing and photographs.
