EDITOR'S RUMBLINGS March 2025

This year it does not appear that many club members are restoring early vehicles, other than Ron Thorp with Harry McNaughton's assistance on the 1930s Triumph Gloria. Warwick Gardner is restoring a vintage Essex as well as his Clement Talbot and I am still working to bring our 1912 Baker Electric back to original, authentic condition. A photo which I have obtained shows it in original condition at the time it was auctioned by Sotheby's after the death of Robert Holmes A Court. Unfortunately, we invariably find improvised and non standard repairs and paint schemes which have been done over the years and have to be corrected. My last two weeks have been spent on the Baker wheels which had to be stripped having had their spokes painted, and not original. Once a car is not original or modified it is immediately devalued. Phil Myhill brought some excellent examples of innovative repairs to Chev. Four front axles to the monthly meeting recently.

Around September or October the events committee hopes to organise a progressive lunch. This involves a number of small courses at different member's residences, but primarily to look in sheds showing work in progress or collections. In past years we have had four or five venues visited for a limited time at each.

In February two new eating places were visited firstly for the shakedown run to Havilah Park Road Café and farm incorporating the watermelon day run. The second was an excellent lunch at the Guyra Bowls Club following a visit to the trout farm.


