Safety Topic

More and more in the News these days are the apparent number of fires starting from Lithium power tool batteries whilst on charge.

We should rethink and try to ensure these are not left on charge overnight in our workshops. Ensure the batteries are hooked up to the correct charger(s).

Using a charger specifically designed for lithium-ion batteries is recommended. These chargers are equipped to deliver the correct voltage and current, preventing overcharging and optimizing the battery's lifespan. Using an incompatible charger can lead to safety risks, fire and damage to the battery.

Avoid Overcharging

Remove the battery from the charger once it's fully charged. Overcharging can lead to reduced battery life and potential safety risks.

Inspect Batteries Regularly Before charging, examine your lithium batteries for any signs of damage, such as dents, cracks, or leaks.
