Your attendance will be much appreciated.

### Contributions

The Committee has decided to implement a donation scheme. This donation scheme is designed to allocate costs fairly among members who directly use specific club facilities or services. Here is a breakdown of the scheme:

#### **Annual Vehicle Inspection**

o Total donation: \$20

o Includes a \$10 contribution for the use of the hoist in the workshop.

#### Hoist Usage

\$10 per event using the hoist in the workshop

#### Workshop Bay Usage

o \$10 per week for the use of a single bay in the workshop.

#### Car Trailer Usage

\$50 per day for using the car trailer.

The rationale for these charges is to ensure that the costs associated with maintaining the club's infrastructure and services (e.g., electricity, hydraulic systems, hoist cables, trailer maintenance) are covered by the individuals who use them, rather than being subsidized by the general membership.

# New Club Logo

#### Barn-find

Not really a barn-find but rather a find in the paddocks. Mr. Roly Dye, a prominent farmer at Hopefield near Corowa NSW donated a VW Country Buggy to the Club. These vehicles were initially specified by the ADF, built and rigorously tested in Australia. The vehicle was initially bought in 1965 by a Rental Company in Corowa and later in 1975 acquired by the Dye Family to be used on their farms. It has been decommissioned in1999 and abandoned in the paddocks.

After the cars were built, the ADF decided to cancel the order as they figured they needed an amphibious 4-wheel configuration, the vehicles were then sold to farmers where this specimen ended up. Clean up is now under way before the car will be displayed in the Learmont Pavilion. Long forgotten beer bottles, gun cartridges and other paraphernalia were discovered during the clean-up.


