CACMC CLUB SANCTIONED EVENTS

Club sanctioned events:

You will notice some events listed on page 14 have a # in the title. This means they are a club sanctioned event where members participation is being sought. These go under club runs in your log book.

A member may advise the club (best the Registrar or Secretary) if they wish to participate in any other club event, be it local or interstate. The club official records that participation and the member may then record the participation under a club event, provided the route to/from (more appropriately for interstate events) is mostly direct.

The operator may choose to use a combination of club and private use entitlements, an outline of which should be advised to the club officials before departure. Obviously for a rally over long distances, club entitlement is appropriate.

If operators wish to combine an interstate club event with a period of private use, that is also permitted under the system principles. Integrity and common sense are required as any seeming abuse will impact the entire historic vehicle community.

MEMBERS PLEASE NOTE: YOU MUST HAVE A LOG BOOK OTHERWISE IT IS ILLEGAL TO TAKE YOUR VEHICLE ON THE ROAD.

Frank and Jacqui's 1971 VG Chrysler Valiant

Frank and Jacqui inherited their car from Jacqui's father Keith who lovingly restored it over 25 years ago. (so technically its Jacqui's car).

The car's interior was re-upholstered and the paint was also redone,

although according to Frank the gold is a little darker than the original colour.

Chrysler only made the VG from 1970 to 1971. This car is a bit of a unicorn as it is one of 10 Stirling Moss limited editions that were built in Adelaide as a special



order for the Chrysler executives. The car came with special options including a centre console and bucket seats. Stirling Moss also insisted on it having a factory fitted black vinyl roof. Enthusiasts think that only three of these now survive.

It was at Wheels 2024 when Frank and Jacqui's car attracted the attention of some enthusiasts, and the true history of the car was revealed. This was later confirmed through the number on the inner guard and via the compliance plate. (Handy things eh!!!).

Powered by a straight six 265 Hemi engine, this is teamed up to a 727 auto driving a standard differential. The driving experience is fantastic according to Frank, and he should know having driven it to several Chryslers on the Murray events previously, and more recently to the Club's outing to The Albion Hotel at Grabben Gullen.

It was great to have Frank and Jacqui along and we hope to see them on many more outings.



At the August meeting we only had one person interested in the Holden Brochure...Scott Molloy, and he walked away with the brochure with our congratulations.


