Important Member Information Historic & Conditional Registration

The MUVCCC is part of the Historic & Classic Club Plates Registration Scheme. Registration of such vehicles is available to Club Members with vehicles which qualify for the scheme. Club Members with such vehicles must carry the "Club Event Program" while participating in club events. (Note: You can also download this to your mobile phone or access to the Club website event page.)

Key Points:

- 1. You must be a financial member of an approved Car Club
- 2. You must also carry the Certificate of Approved Operation whilst using the vehicle.
- 3. If you drive a modified vehicle, it is highly recommended you carry the appropriate Engineering Certificate.
- 4. If you are using your vehicle for any other purpose, you must fill in your log book. This must be completed before leaving your residence and vehicle use under the logging date is valid for that nominated date only.

<u>Please note:</u> It is your responsibility as Member to ensure that you are a Current Financial Club Member, otherwise you are deemed to be driving an <u>unregistered vehicle</u>.

<u>All memberships fall due on 30th June each year.</u>

Keep well and travel safe, particularly during the busy holiday season.


President - MUVCCC





Member Story: The Power & The Passion: Julie Hoy's love of V8s, Fords & a special BF!



Long term club member, Julie Hoy has quite the collection of special motor vehicles... all V8s. However, a Toyota Landcruiser has crept into the fleet to balance the Ford domination of 4 collectible motor cars.

Julie grew up in Sydney, moved to Albury and then in 1977, moved to the Ulladulla-Milton area. Julie worked at the Marlin Hotel, some of the servo's, Noel Butler's cake shop, doing some book-keeping at Home Care and then Medicare. Julie loved Medicare and the opportunity to help people, but when it was absorbed into Centrelink, it wasn't quite the same and she chose to leave.

Julie's father got her interested in cars & bikes and some of her fondest memories are learning from her Dad as she started working on her 350 Twin motor bike in her teenage years. Her father often had Fords and Julie got her licence on a ZA Ford Fairlane V8. Because of her knowledge of motor bikes, Julie was offered a position at the tender age of 16 by a motor cycle dealership for her knowledge on parts – so hard work and Dad's coaching paid off!!

Unsurprisingly, Julie's first husband (Alan Warner) also loved motor vehicles and he enjoyed racing motors bikes at Sydney Showground (sidecars) and at Oran Park (road bikes). In addition, Julie's sister also liked racing motor bikes. There seems to be a bit of a family trend here!!

Upon moving to Albury, Julie had a Holden Torana, to which they arranged a local mechanic to add a turbocharger!! Julie used this vehicle to attend the Peter Wherrett Advanced Driving School with her "passing certificate" signed by Peter Finlay.

As is so often the case, when her child Rachelle was born, the Torana had to go and was replaced by a Holden Commodore VC – naturally a V8, which she kept for 16 years!

Julie faced some tough years as sadly, her first husband Alan passed away in 1983 & her son Brett was born 2 months later. Julie became very hands on & self-sufficient

as she cared for her children ensuring they always took priority.

As years passed, Julie found love again upon meeting Greg Hoy. In her younger years, Holden was the preferred brand, but she moved to "The Dark Side" (her words!) when her late husband Greg, showed her the benefits. Julie says "Greg was a Ford Man - Through & through".

Initially, they owned a Ford XC, flirted with a Jaguar, then a Fairlane and a Fairmont (Julie admitted to hating the Fairmont). This was followed by the Ford XR8 and then the bright orange Ute that Julie still loves to drive – it has so many special memories for Julie.

Julie explains "I just love cars! They are my comfort zone. Put me in a garage rather than a kitchen anytime!"

Whilst Julie's interest is Ford, she states that she does love all cars on the proviso that they are "Original & cared for".

Within her fleet, the XB is the one that holds her strongest affection (the favourite child), although it does have some foibles...particularly when cold.



However, her Prize winning 2006 Ford FPV GTP BF – Mark II also holds a special place in her heart. Purchasing the vehicle from a close friend, it has only 65K on the odometer. Inside and out, GTP "Build No: 251" (of 361 built) is truly something special. No work was required when she took delivery and she has fitted number plates that reflect the car's uniqueness.

Whilst the vehicle is largely standard, the original owner did "check the box" for *John Bowe Performance Package* which extracted **another 50kw(!!)** from the already impressive Boss 290KW 5.4Litre V8 high performance engine.



The gear box is a ZF 6 speed automatic, whilst Brembo Brakes ensure the GTP stops well...very well!! It has 6 piston calipers on the front and 4-piston on the rear together with ABS and EBD (Electronic Brake Distribution)


The wheels are 19"x 8 shod with 245/35/ZR19 tyres. In fact Julie has 2 sets of wheels. In our first photo, we see the alternate wheels fitted.



When Julie entered her vehicle in the 2024 All Ford Day, she took home 2nd place...because the winner was a 2012 Ford that never left the garage. *Bugger!! Beaten by a "Hidden not Driven" garage ornament!*

This vehicle also included the revolutionary "data dot security". This system was to prevent vehicles being stolen for parts & rebirthing! The vehicle's colour is described a "Ego Grey" with dealer fitted stripes & decals.

Julie loves how easy the car is to drive, the reliability, the "Push Button Start" and... the "Push Button Boot Release". In addition, the engine bay is a work of art and so <u>very</u> clean. The front bucket seats are heavily bolstered so making an elegant entry or exit requires some practice and perhaps a little gymnastic skill.



However, with a low ride height and very low-profile tyres, Julie needs to be careful of potholes, driveways and anything else that may harm her GTP. Of course, insurance premiums aren't cheap, but Julie has quite a "Risk Management" approach to minimise any potential threats — avoid public car parks!! But all this pales into insignificance when the intoxicating rumble of the GTP's V8 comes to life.



As time progresses, Julie knows it may be difficult to get parts, but that is part of owning such a collectible motor car. She is also proud of her clean licence. She says, these days it is due to careful driving, but when she was younger, she was a bit lucky!

For Julie, owning this and all her vehicles, fills her with joy. Whether it be the "sometimes temperamental XB", the Ute that hold very special memories, The BA GTP or her prize-winning BF each is are a part of Julie's "life's history" and all are special.





Changes to the Model Constitution

Following a careful review of the "model constitution" which the MUVCCC utilises, our Registrar Joe Bowdler has identified a recent minor change to Clause 35 and presented this to attendees. **Clause 35** states: -

35 Postal, electronic or combined ballots

- (1) The association may hold a postal, electronic or combined ballot, as determined by the committee, to decide any matter other than an appeal under clause 8.
- (2) The ballot must be conducted in accordance with Schedule 2 of the Regulation.

There is no material impact arising from this change (see above in red), but it simply means a ballot can be conducted using a combination of post and/or electronic ballots.

Accordingly, a vote was held at the meeting and members agreed to continue with the adoption of the Model Constitution, currently the 2024 revision, as the Club's Constitution, with formal acceptance of the changes arising from the latest [2024] revision.

<u>Clubs NSW support MUVCCC to purchase a</u> Defibrillator

Following a suggestion by Club President, Colin Spicer, the committee agreed to seek a grant from *ClubsNSW* to purchase a defibrillator for our club events should either a member or the general public be in need of assistance. A submission was prepared and we were fortunate to receive grants from our 3 local clubs being: -

The Milton Ulladulla Bowling Club The Milton Ulladulla Ex Servos Club The Mollymook Golf Club



Each Club contributing equal shares towards a grant of \$4000 which enabled the MUVCCC to purchase a defibrillator and related equipment from St Johns Ambulance. We do express our gratitude for the support of our local clubs and encourage members to enjoy the facilities provided by them.

If you wish to be part of the team who will operate the defibrillator*, contact our Club Secretary, Jane McLennan.

*Note: The operational design of the defibrillator is to enable ANYONE to be able to use the device without training should the need arise.
